How-to... Pupil Interaction



Kim's games are a great way to reinforce and practise vocabulary and exemplify the use of simple and repetitive instructions which learners will quickly appropriate themselves.



Command forms such as: Observe or Observe well, followed by Close your eyes, Open your eyes and the question: What's missing? can be used every time you play a Kim's game.

Give the commands and ask the question yourself to start with (or use the sound files provided on the PowerPoints or Animations) until learners are familiar enough to utter the expressions themselves when playing – you could have a game leader in charge of the game or section of the game.

Other expressions can gradually be added in this game, such as:

Are you ready? Let's start! Concentrate well! Is it correct? Yes, it's correct. No, it's not correct...

You'll be amazed at how much extra vocabulary, given a meaningful context, your pupils will be able to add and memorise in a fun and non-threatening way!
